EXPLANATION: Professor Beehler received his doctorate in English from the University of California, Los Angeles, in 1978. He joined the faculty of Montana State University as an Assistant Professor in 1985 and was promoted to Associate Professor in 1987. He was promoted to Full professor in 2000. He served as Department Head in English from 2002 to 2006.

Professor Beehler's scholarly fields are modern literature and literary theory; he is also increasingly known for his work on architecture and literature.
