The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) had two purposes. One to conserve our natural resources and the other to put Americans back to work during the Great Depression



Civilian Conservation Corps was part of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal Program From 1932-1942. Fort Missoula served as the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) training, supply and administration center for the Rocky Mountain Region. Workers were mobilized from Fort Missoula to work at Yellowstone and Glacier National Parks. The proposed park theming is based upon this significant part of the parks and recreation movement.
