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GFC MSU [graduated](#) 323 students who successfully completed their course work to earn an associate degree or certificate. Collectively the 323 students earned more than 383 degrees and certificates. Of the graduates, 55 students earned multiple degrees, 51 graduated with honors, 76 with high honors, and 54 were veterans.

In the spring 2018 graduating class, two Dual Enrollment students received their Associate of Arts and 11 earned their certificates prior to earning their high school diplomas.

The class of 2018 celebrated the first class of [computer programming graduates](#) at Great Falls College MSU. Beginning in 2016, the computer programming program teaches students the skills needed to thrive as a computer programmer and to also work as a systems analyst, filling a long-time need in the Great Falls area.

Following spring 2018 commencement, GFC MSU proudly recognized 200 students as members of the [Dean's list](#) for spring 2018 semester.

100% of Surgical Technology graduates passed their certification exams.

The Center for Lifelong Learning at Great Falls College MSU hosted cyber security camps this summer for kids to help get them interested in pursuing a career in the field. The camp ran June 11-15 and was open to students ages 12 to 18. This is the first time the college has offered [CyberCamp](#), which was developed by the Air Force Association as part of the CyberPatriot National Youth Cyber Education Program.

In June, 23 choir members and seven community members travelled to [Italy](#) through a study abroad program offered through The Center for Lifelong Learning at Great Falls College MSU. The 10-day trip included two choral concerts in Florence as well as visits to Verona, Venice, and Lake Garda.

Montana Institute on Educational Technology held [MIET Tech Days](#) 2018 on June 12-13 at Great Falls College MSU. MIET Tech Days offers teachers two days of tech-related training on a variety of topics. This year's session topics included virtual reality, infographics, Chromebooks, Google Earth projects and more. College credit was available.

GFC MSU partnered with Montana Career Pathways to bring welding instructors from across the region to refresh and learn new welding technologies. Hosting these regional trainings provides the College the opportunity to showcase its facilities and the quality education our welding students receive.
