The SUB serves as the host location for many public events, and funding is needed to maintain the facility in a manner that meets expectations of students and guests.

The upgraded equipment has changed the curriculum and is directly tied to the use of additional consumable materials by students taking Sculpture courses. Increased revenue from course fees will permit the studio to run more effectively and smoothly to create a more conducive studio environment for student creativity. Justification: The course fees for Sculpture have not changed for a long time. I found evidence that it hasn't changed in over 20 years. The fee of \$60.00 is simply not adequate for a course that utilizes as many processes and materials that are mandated in the Sculpture curriculum.
