Spring Career Fair - The MSU Northern Spring 2019 Career Fair (Feb. 14), set three new records. The most employers registered (58). The most employers to stay and interview students (14). The most students who visited with employers (over 300).

Education Scholarship - The MSU Northern Alumni Foundation announced that they have received an estate bequest of \$682,000 to create an endowed scholarship fund for education students.

Wrestlers Place at Nationals - The MSU Northern Lights took 10th place with a score of 50.5 at the NAIA National Championships.

Commencement Speaker - Matthew Daniel Cronin was named the 2019 Commencement speaker. Mr. Cronin is the CEO and co-owner of C&B Operations, LLC, a John Deere agricultural dealership business headquartered in Gettysburg, SD. C&B owns and operates 37 dealership locations across six states.

MSU-Northern's Fall Dean's List – The Fall Dean's List contains 358 students. To be included in the Dean's List, students must carry a minimum of 12 credits and earn a grade point average of 3.25 or better.

Scholarship Awards Ceremony - There were 186 students who were given a total of 272 scholarships. The scholarships varied in value, but in the end \$207,353 dollars were given away. That represents \$14k more than last year!

The Golden "N" Award - awarded annually by the MSU-Northern Student Senate. The Golden "N" Award is the most prestigious award an MSU-Northern faculty or staff member can receive. This year's winners were: Tammy Boles, Activities & Events Director; Jennifer Henderson, Employment Services Coordinator; Sherry Kegel, Student Health Services Director; and Chad Spangler, Assistant Professor of Health Promotion.

More Articulation Agreements - Dr. Dave Krueger, Dean of MSUN College of Technology, and Dr. Margaret Campbell, Director of American Indian Education, have been visiting the Tribal Colleges to further relationships and develop more articulation agreements between the various institutions.

First AAUW Meeting - The first American Association of University Women Student Chapter meeting took place on February 26 at the Chancellor's house. Seven students attended, all of whom were nominated to join as student leaders due to their strong academic performance and demonstrated leadership potential.
