eLearning & Faculty Development

 Helena College stands as a pioneer within the university system, being among the first to transition to Canvas as our Learning Management System (LMS). As of May, we have seamlessly started utilizing Canvas for our teaching endeavors. <u>Canvas LMS</u>

- The LMS transition project has prompted the Helena College eLearning Team to formulate a new
 vision regarding the utilization of our Learning Management System. The expansive array of
 features and tools provided by Canvas enables us to surpass the capabilities of our previous
 LMS. By strategically adopting Canvas LMS, our goal is to redefine the boundaries of teaching
 and learning, empowering our institution, faculty, and students with unparalleled opportunities for
 growth and success.
- The Helena College eLearning team has developed the following Goals for Canvas Adoption:
 - Modernizing teaching practices and infrastructure.
 - o Improving accessibility and ease of use for both instructors and students.
 - Enhancing collaboration and communication within the learning environment.
 - Streamlining administrative tasks related to course management, data analysis, and reporting.
 - Incorporating diverse stakeholders at the college to leverage the Canvas LMS, thereby enhancing support for students.

 Helena College offered a four-week welding training class in partnership with the Department of Corrections. Cody Torres created the curriculum and taught the course to a group of six students using a mobile welding lab trailer owned by Great Falls College.
