MSU ranked among the world's top universities in the <u>newest Leiden Rankings</u>. MSU was ranked 1,133 on the list out of 1,506 universities globally.

Montana State University has been ranked a <u>Top Veteran-Friendly School by U.S. Veterans Magazine</u> and is the only Montana institution included in the magazine's 2024 list.

Two MSU initiatives will help address the need for teachers in Montana's rural schools. A \$3 million grant will support dozens of science, technology, engineering and math teachers in rural and underserved areas of Montana, and MSU's Rural Teaching Exploration provides MSU students a formal classroom experience during their first semester.

MSU and Gallatin Valley communities donated the equivalent of 652,876 pounds of food for the local foodbanks, resulting in a victory for the Can the Griz food drive.

Author <u>Michael Punke will deliver Montana State's First Year Student Convocation</u> lecture in August. Incoming students will be asked to read his book "Fire and Brimstone" to expand their understanding of Montana's history.

MSU Dean of Nursing Sarah Shannon received the <u>State Advocate Award</u> from the American Association of Nurse Practitioners, an annual award given to one from each state who serves as a role model in the health care industry.

A <u>Department of Ecology</u> researcher is exploring how <u>Montana rangeland and crops respond</u> to drought stress by delving into plant-microbe interactions.

During National First-Generation College Celebration Day, <u>MSU's First-Generation Committee</u> <u>hosted a series of events</u> to celebrate and support first generation students, including a book club, seminars and a student panel.

Montana State welcomes two new leaders - <u>Sally Mudiamu</u> as new dean of Global Engagement and International Programs and William Thomas as new dean of College of Letters and Science.

MSU's Western Transportation Institute was <u>awarded \$4.7 million from the US Department of Transportation</u> to improve road safety in rural communities.

The U.S. Department of Energy <u>featured MSU research in its Science Highlights series</u>. MSU's work focuses on camelina, an oilseed crop related to canola that is a possible sustainable source of biofuels.
