Dr. Bill McCaw, after 25 years of dedicated service to The University of Montana, has merited the commendation of the Board of Regents of the Montana University System and has earned the title of Professor of Educational Leadership Emeritus.

EXPLANATION

Dr. McCaw received a Bachelor of Arts in Art Education from Arizona State University, a Master of Education degree in Educational Leadership from the University of Montana, and a Doctor of Education Degree in Educational Leadership from the University of Montana.
