Intent: To support the use of an Energy Performance Contract to perform energy saving and deferred maintenance renovations as prioritized by Montana State University (MSU) Facilities Services for the approved projects.

- Whereas, the Montana State University (MSU) Facilities Services have deemed the following energy savings and deferred maintenance projects a priority:
 - Indoor and outdoor lighting upgrades
 - Building mechanical upgrades
 - Heat plant upgrades; and,
- Whereas, the Building Fees can be used to fund projects like these, requiring an Energy
- 7 Performance Contract (EPC), and if the University borrows money to pay for these EPC
- 8 projects, the Building Fees can then be used to repay debt (including interest) and may also be
- 9 pledged under the University's bond indenture for its general revenue bonds; and,
- Whereas, this phase of development includes up to \$30 million in renovations and
- improvements, which will begin seeing cost-savings in energy costs about 20+ years after
- installment, after the debt has been fully repaid; now, therefore be it
