Thursday, July 9, 2026

Meeting convened at 9:01 am

Regents Present: Loren Bough, Chair, Jeff Southworth, Todd Buchanan, Dan Spoon, Dean Folkvord, Heather Hoyer, and Quindy Gronley. Ex officio members present included Commissioner of Higher Education Clayton Christian and Governor Greg Gianforte, represented by Manish Bhatt. She noted that the proposed revisions would better align the Board's policy with current regulatory best practices. She also presented a proposed new policy regarding the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement. Discussion followed.

I am a current staff and non-tenure faculty member at MSU - Bozeman. I want to submit a public comment about the ongoing struggles of NTT faculty and staff to support our growing student body on low wages. As a land grant institution we support a wide variety of students with different needs. As the university continues to grow, we are watching staff wages, NTT wages, and the number of staff and NTT positions remain stagnant. I would love to hear in future meetings and communications how the Board of Regents plans to support these positions (who do much of the heavy lifting for student success) in an increasingly unaffordable city with a student body that continues to hit record numbers of enrollment.
