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(3) The feasibility Study will include at least the following information: (a) Nursing manpower studies documenting the need for the

program as it relates to plans for total state resources and nursing education needs in the state.

In the Helena community there are currently 55,716 residents in the Helena/Lewis and Clark area. This compares with 89,847 residents in the Billings area, 27,509 residents in the Bozeman area, 34,606 residents in the Butte/Silverbow county area,

56,690 residents in the Great Falls area, and

57,053 residents in the Missoula area (US Department of Commerce, 2000).

The Helena and Lewis and Clark county area is one of nineteen counties in the state of Montana reporting an increase in population between the year 2000 and 2002. That increase was 1.5% and it is estimated that the largest population group is the 40-65 year olds. By 2010, the estimated population increase for the Lewis and Clark county is 8%, with anticipated health care needs also rising in the Helena community. This phenomenon would increase the need for health care Choices in the Lewis and Clark county area, thus providing more health care opportunities for consumers, as well as for nursing student education. (US Department of Commerce, 2002).

See April 2003 Feasibility Study submitted by UM-Helena to the Montana State Board of Nursing for potential student and employer current and projected needs.

(b) Purpose and classification of the program

Included in the work-to-date on the proposed curriculum for the University of Montana-Helena Nursing Program's Certificate in Practical Nursing to Associate of Science leading to Registered Nursing program. The University of Montana- Helena COT and the University of Montana-Missoula COT continue to collaborate on similar curriculum in scope and sequence to facilitate articulation.

(h) Anticipated Student Population

From November 2002 to January 2003, the nursing program at UM-Helena conducted a Needs Assessment of the practical nursing students and the Licensed Practical Nurses in a five county area surrounding Helena. The results of the Needs Assessment indicate that there is a population of 160 potential students interested in an Associate of Science degree leading to Registered Nursing in the Helena area. Most of these potential students indicated the desire to have the program campusbased, in Helena.

(i) Tentative timetable for planning and initiating the program.

The proposal for the certificate practical nursing program and the addition of the Associate of Science in Nursing degree would be scheduled to be implemented Fall semester 2004. This allows nursing faculty to complete the mission, organizational framework, educational objectives, proposed curriculum, and evaluation plan according to the Montana State Board of Nursing Standards for Montana Nursing Education programs. The nursing faculty and chairperson plan on completing the remainder of the application for initial approval for the October 2003 Montana State Board of Nursing meetings.

(j) Consideration of how the proposed program may affect existing nursing program in the state, and indication that plans and the feasibility study regarding the proposed program have been shared with the directors of existing programs in the state.
