This letter is in response to the April 22, 2003 meeting of the Education Committee of the Board related to the proposal by UM-Helena COT to initiate an ASN-RN program. We were asked to meet with UM-H to discuss the impact this expansion would have on the nursing program at Carroll College. We have met with UM-H on April 29, May 27 and June 12, 2003 to discuss their proposal and have prepared the attached tables documenting the numbers of students needing clinical placements at the two hospitals in Helena, St. Peter's Community Hospital and VA Fort Harrison. UM-H provided Carroll College with their projected numbers of students at the June 12, 2003 meeting.

From this data as well as meetings with the clinical agencies, we feel that the expansion/change at UM-H would **negatively impact** the quality of the clinical experience that we can provide Carroll College students. We cannot support the UM-H change/expansion for the following reasons:

- 1. We currently have difficulty placing our 100+ students in clinical experiences in Helena. We initiated a major curriculum adjustment this academic year to accommodate for this competition for placements with UM-H. Adding another RN program in the clinical sites will significantly increase the competition. If the new program at UM-H is initiated, Carroll College will not be able to serve the clinical needs of the current sophomore class of 45+ students for progression, as there is no room for expansion of clinical sites or times. Carroll College will be restricted to clinicals on Thursday and Friday only with UM-H taking Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday for clinicals at all the agencies (see Tables 1 and 2 attached).
- 2. Carroll College will need to cap enrollments to 25 students per class cohort, because of an overload of RN students in clinical placements with the proposed UM-H expansion. This would, in fact, **decrease** the number of baccalaureate RN nurses the state can prepare.
- 3. The UM-H expansion specifically compromises the availability of RN preceptors for the Carroll College Capstone Course in spring semesters. Table 2b (attached) displays an overload of RN students at the agencies in spring semester. The Capstone Course is a hallmark of our program and an essential learning experience for students. It is highly regarded by students and employers as a program asset.
- 4. Needs of the Helena community will not be met in this expansion as documented by the April 2003 UM-H feasibility study (p. 16) in which agencies preferred a staffing mix of LPNs and baccalaureate prepared RNs and also reported a low vacancy rate in Helena of 0 − 2.3 RN positions (p. 15, UM-H April Study).

The Helena community presently has two outstanding programs for educational preparation of quality nurses with the Carroll College RN-baccalaureate program and the current UM-H LPN program. Both programs have high passage rates on the licensure examinations for RNs and LPNs and employers are seeking the graduates. Carroll College continues to be willing to work in partnership with UM-H to put in place a specific articulation agreement that would serve the needs of the LPNs in the community wishing to advance to RN baccalaureate status.

With current programs for next year there is competition for clinical space and need to negotiate days and times with UM-H. There is presently an overload in clinical areas and Carroll College made adjustments to the curriculum to accommodate agencies and clinical availability.

*If new UM-H programs are established, there will be an **increase of 40 students needing clinical placements** in spring semester and students will be in clinical areas year round. Potential is very high for overload of staff and patients willing to work with nursing students.
