
College financial aid is determined by financial need. The greater your financial need, the greater your opportunity to qualify for scholarships and grants.

Most colleges give you the first two years to decide what career pathway you want to take. It's important to dabble!


You may start making money earlier, but your wages increase with a degree and you will have more job stability and opportunities. Investing in a couple years of school could lead to higher wages.

There are multiple ways to make sure you graduate with a degree/certification with minimal debt. Take advantage of summer jobs, in-state tuition, and programs that offer credentials with shorter time-to-completion.

#### **Sprint Degrees**



Learn quicker and start earning money sooner with Montana University System Sprint Degrees.

Sprint Degrees are accelerated, high-quality college programs offering flexible schedules and summer coursework to condense bachelor's degrees to 2.5 years and associate degrees to 12–18 months.





## **Transferring Colleges**

Have you thought about 2 years at community college, and then 2 years on a university campus?

<u>2</u> years at a community college can cost about the same as just <u>1</u> year at a four-year university.

It's never been easier to take equivalent courses at different campuses across the Montana University System to transfer.

Many programs can be completed in as little as 2 to 3 semesters and are designed so you can balance them part-time or in the evenings along with a job.


#### **MUS Transfer**

The Montana University System has created a common-course system to make sure courses are labeled the same. This makes it easy to know which courses taken at one campus have the same on another.

#### 2+2 Honor Scholarship

You could go to school to receive your Bachelor degree and have your tuition waived for 2 years!

Attending your local community college allows you to keep costs down and to make the transition to a large campus a little easier.

#### College can sound like an expensive choice.

Scholarships, grants, and aid can make the cost of your education in Montana more manageable.

#### **Grants**

Grants are financial aid that doesn't have to be repaid.

#### **Scholarships**

Like grants, scholarships are money for college that you don't have to repay. These can be local, national, or even offered by your college.

#### Work-study


A federal work program where you earn money to help pay for college expenses.

#### Have you heard of FAFSA?

(Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

FAFSA is a FREE application you fill out that tells you how much financial aid you are eligible for. This aid will come in the form of Pell grants (doesn't need to be repaid), federal loans, and work study.

This is one of the best opportunities for getting help with costs!




MT Treasure State First Generation Scholarship

MSU supports their first generation students by offering a \$1,500 scholarship per year. The award is given to MT residents who self-report they are the first person in their family to go to college.

The Grizzly Promise funds up to four years, or eight semesters, of UM tuition and fees.

If you're from a family with an income of \$50,000 or less, UM is dedicated to making sure your tuition is covered so you can attend University of Montana tuition-free.

## Dual Enrollment + One-Two-Free

Save your time, money, and help while transitioning to college

Dual Enrollment provides high school students the opportunity to take college courses while still in high school.

Dual Enrollment allows students to take 100 and 200 level college courses.



To enroll in the One-Two-Free Dual Enrollment program, ask your school counselor for approval and the proper course registration form.

Get college credit for taking your high school classes

Students demonstrating hardship

Tackle two things at once

May apply for scholarship for additional courses 88.9% of Montana public high schools offer dual enrollment courses.

On average, about 60% of dual enrollment students attend a college in the Montana University System.

Upon graduation, Dual Enrollment (DE) students average \$570 less in student loans <u>per credit</u> than non-dual enrollment graduates.

That's over \$1700 in savings!
